BEHAVIOUR

Rules
Be your best
Be Ready
Be Respectful
Be Safe





Above are the three clear rules we ask the children to follow: be ready, be respectful and be safe.

As a school, we want to celebrate all of the children for their over and above (exceptional) behaviour. We will be having Friday treats and daily VIPs to recognise those children. The children are also aware of a series of consequences that will be followed if they do not adhere to the Loughton School rules. If this happens, you will be informed by your child's class teacher or, in more serious circumstances, the year manager.

UNIFORM AND SCHOOL BAGS

We ask that you support your child to be school-ready, which includes them wearing the correct school uniform, alongside suitable black shoes (not trainers). No non-uniform hoodies are permitted for PE days.

They will need a small book-bag for transporting reading books / homework folders etc, and a healthy lunch box if required. Large rucksacks are discouraged due to limited cloakroom space.

Please make sure any belongings are named, as this is the only way to guarantee the return of lost items.

GAMES / P.E. DAYS

HB1, HB2 and HB3 – Tuesday and Friday HB4 – Monday and Friday



Please can you ensure children come to school 'PE ready' for those days, as this allows for a full active hour. Children will not have time to change in school. We will be going outside in most kinds of weather and suggest that you send your child with suitably seasonal clothing.

Finally, children are not allowed any jewellery in school, apart from plain ear studs, which need to be removable. Long hair must be tied back for Games and P.E.

HOMEWORK BINGO

Aside from regular reading and times table practise at home, our year 3 children will be given a 'Homework Bingo' to complete, which will be issued on a dedicated year 3 homework online noticeboard called padlet. Tasks set each half-term will link to the learning taking place at school and aim to support areas identified by the teaching team.

The Homework Bingo will be set in the first week of each half term (with the exception of Autumn 1, which will be issued in week 2/3) and is due in the last week of term. Specific dates and further details are included on the homework bingo sheet.

Children will be issued with their own homework folder, which they can use to store and submit all completed tasks throughout the year. Some tasks may require photographic evidence – we are happy for these to be emailed to class teachers if home printing is an issue.

READING RECORDS

At Loughton School, we want our children to develop a passion for reading and something that can be enjoyed at home as well as at school. For that reason, we have given each child an orange book in which to record the books that they are reading. There is space in these books for an adult, or older sibling, who has listened to them read, to write a comment or to simply sign the page.

We would like children to read regularly at home and discuss their books with an adult/older sibling. Even if you feel they are confident readers, they will benefit from showing off their skills and talking about their reading, to show they have understood the text.

Every child in year 3 will be able to choose a reading book to bring home each week. We encourage the children to read a little every night but suggest a minimum of 4 times a week.

PARENTMAIL

We will send all of our school communications via ParentMail. We use ParentMail +Pay for payments for trips and visits. Additionally, it means you can easily and safely pay for your child's hot school lunches. Please contact the school office if you need any help.

YEAR 3 CURRICULUM WEB

Lots of parents ask us at the beginning of the year how else they can support and extend their child's learning at home, in addition to the homework set. Pre-learning topic related vocabulary and beginning each new topic with some understanding would help your child to make the best progress. On our padlet page under 'curriculum web' is an overview of the subjects taught and details of what your child will be covering within this subject. This is the case for all subjects such as French, art and PE.
