Learning this term

This term, the title of our theme is 'From Darkness to Light.' The aim of this theme is to inspire year 6 children across a range of different subjects including science, history, reading, writing and RE. It links the darkness of World War Two through our chosen text "Letters from the Lighthouse", to how light is produced and the Jewish festival of Hanukkah. During our learning journey, we will uncover the secrets of one of the most significant events of the 20th Century and its local significance including learning about Bletchley Park. Any answers to the work will be uploaded to the padlet page on a Monday and the children will then need to email their completed, marked work to their class teacher or bring their book into school every Tuesday.

Each week, pupils will receive arithmetic and English/SPAG, (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) homework. Theme homework is set as a project piece each half term. Please check the year group padlet page for any work set and support your child with the completion of it.

We would also like children to read regularly and discuss their books with an adult at home. Even if you feel they are confident readers, they benefit from showing off their skills and talking about their reading. There will be a termly reading challenge on the padlet page.
