Mr George - I went to the beach and saw a re-enactment!


#### Students' Holidays

I really enjoyed the summer holidays!



1. Who came up with LS News?

The school council organised a competition to name the new children's newsletter we were about to publish. The winning entry was 'LS News' because it was short and snappy and everyone liked it.

2. What was the first LS News like?

The first edition of LS News was just two A4 pieces of paper, so four sides altogether. It was set up to have eight different pieces of information. It was a very simple format to start with, easy to put together and not too expensive for the office staff to photocopy.

3. When was LS news first published?

I really can't remember and I've tried to look back and find out! We aimed to put out at least three editions a year, one each term, and sometimes we managed to produce more. The 7<sup>th</sup> edition celebrated one year of LS News.

4. Where did the first LS News meeting take place?


The first meeting took place in the school library. We tried different times for our meetings as it was sometimes difficult to get everyone together.

5. Why was the LS News invented?

There had been a newsletter in the 1990s called 'Loughton Link'. It was an A5 booklet and had news and photographs in and was written for the parents. The idea behind LS News was to produce a newsletter for the children, written by the children which would encourage as many pupils as possible to get involved in writing about whatever interested them.

Yes!


### Do you have any children of your own?
