I invited 18 of my friends from school and almost all of them came.




I helped mum to decorate the house and had 5 pumpkins which I carved myself. My best carving was a ghost on a white pumpkin. In one of the rooms it

can make the design a reality.



Summer (HB6): I'm looking forward to the holidays. The best thing of all is putting up all the decorations. I'd like to get a doll this year.





Oliver (HB11): I'm going to my cousin's house for Christmas. I'm really hoping that I get an X-box and I think I will!




Leighton (HB12): I'm looking forward to seeing my family at Christmas time. I'm hoping for a bumble bee transformer toy.


