Before we go....

- ▶ Please make sure the office has a copy of your child's passport.
- ▶ If you are not a British passport holder, you may need a visa so please let the office know ASAP if this is the case.
- ▶ Make sure that you have applied for a GHIC card for your child and send a copy of this to the office.
- ▶ Please make sure the office have up-to-date details for at least TWO contacts.



How will we get there?

Children to arrive at 05:30am on Paynes Drive.

Coach will depart at 05:50am

Drive to Folkestone where there is a toilet that the children can use. They can also have a snack at this time.

10:50am Folkestone to Calais by Eurotunnel (35 mins)

2pm Visit to the chocolatiere workshop

Drive to the hotel (30 minutes)

Late afternoon - WE ARRIVE and settle into our accommodation



What will you need for the journey?

Have something to eat before you leave,
especially if you take travel sickness tablets

Bring enough food (a snack and lunch) and drinks (not fizzy)
packed in a day bag with a re-useable bottle for the week.



How will parents know we've arrived safely?



The school will contact you via ParentMail when we reach the Eurotunnel and the hotel.

That's why it's important we have your correct contact number!

We will also put a regular "blog" update on the website – this will be daily as long as internet connection allows.

Accommodation: bedrooms of 6-8 children in large rooms, each with an en-suite bathroom. All rooms will have an adult either next door or at the end of the corridor. Rooms have bunk beds.

Meals will be eaten in a large dining room on site with other school groups.

What's the accommodation like?

Bedrooms are grouped together with staff members on same floor. Rooms are all very similar.





There is a mix of bunk beds and single beds. Rooms have adequate storage and furniture for the children to be comfortable. The bathrooms are spacious and we will expect all the children to shower either at night or in the morning. They will organise this within their room groups.

Plenty of outside space for relaxing and games.
Children will be given clear boundaries of where they can go.



Indoor activity rooms where the children will be able to spend their free time. Activities organised by our animateur in the evening.



Large dining area with a new terrace planned for the summer to give space for all children to sit comfortably for meals.





Meals are traditional French food. The children will have a starter, main course, cheese course and dessert in the evening.

Please let the office know PRIOR to the trip if your child has any dietary requirements.

Breakfast

Children will be able to help themselves to a variety of breakfast items. One croissant per child but other bread products, cereals and jams.

Lundi

Set off, travel and arrive for evening meal.

Practise fire drill and learn general hotel rules.

Find out room groups, unpack and settle in.

Meet our "animateur".

What to do if you take medicine

All medication must be in a named original bottle or wrapping

Must be given to Mrs Ross, our designated medical person, with details of when it needs to be given and whether any has already been taken that day

If any other medical needs arise we will telephone the contact number given to us on the details you have provided.



What if my child gets travel sick?

Always eat something before taking travel sickness medication

Try it out beforehand, to check for any adverse reactions

Bring plenty of travel sickness medicine

Unused medication will be handed back to parents on our return.

What spending money will I need?

45 Euros maximum to be handed into school prior to the trip.

A selection of note sizes and coins in a named envelope.

Include a purse/wallet in your suitcase

50 cent coins are very useful for toilet stops

5 euros in coins if possible (market challenge)



CAN TAKE:



THEY ARE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

Cameras (disposable or standard cameras which are only for taking pictures)

Books, card games, travel games etc

It's best to name everything

CANNOT TAKE:



mobile phones, hair straighteners, hairdryers, electronic games, iPod, iPad

DO NOT INCLUDE ANY ELECTRONIC TAG DEVICES IN YOUR CHILD'S LUGGAGE

Food or drink (other than in day bag for the outward journey)

This list is provided as a guide only. Please email Miss Hawkes/Mrs Holliday if you are unsure.

- Check the weather forecast for the week.
- Enough clothes to wear, but not too many that you can't lift your case upstairs!
- Slippers/Crocs (for indoors only)
- A small, sturdy rucksack/backpack to carry water and lunch every day
- Water bottle which can be refilled each day
- Sun cream and hat in case of hot weather
- A jumper, waterproof jacket and sensible shoes for wet days and walking
- If you are sensitive to insect bites, please pack insect repellent
- Hayfever medication if needed
- Wash bag and a towel (for washing or showering – we will not be swimming)
- Small packable microfibre towel & beach shoes – if you have them.



We will give you a school contact number before we go for emergencies.

We will be in daily contact with school.

Children will be in charge of their own rooms and equipment. They will need to work together to keep rooms tidy as they will be cleaned daily and points will be awarded for clean and tidy rooms.

Please show the children:

how to recognise their own clothes (preferably named)

how to hang up a wet towel so that it will be fit to use another time!

We will send a reminder during the week before we leave about final arrangements – so don't worry about forgetting anything...



Important

Before you leave, please check with us that you are up to date with the following:

You have signed in for this evening

Consent form (with medical details) has been completed

School has two contact numbers and these are correct

Payments for the trip are up to date

Passport and GHIC cards need checking and copying in school as soon as possible – they will then be collected for travel prior to the trip. Possibly 1 – 2 weeks before.
