

## Hello and welcome to the Newsletter from the Governing Board of Loughton School.

The role of the board of governors takes place in the background and as such the children and parents don't get to know much about us. We are hoping that this newsletter will help parents know a little more about who we are and what we do.

As an academy, the governors at Loughton School are actually called trustees. Our trustees include members of staff, parents from the school and other co-opted members of the community.

The trustees at Loughton school are a positive team of individuals who enjoy working together. When we are not meeting face to face, we communicate with each other using secure, online tools. Our main contributions happen during our regular meetings. The full board of trustees meets once every half term and there are a number of sub-committees that meet regularly to handle specific areas of the school's business.

We don't take part in the day-to-day running of the school, that is done by our excellent leadership team, led by the headteacher.

Our role is more strategic. We have three main jobs to do

- Set the overall vision and ethos of the school
- Hold the headteacher to account
- Oversee the school's budget

Our meetings are usually aimed at some or all of these objectives and we receive regular feedback so that we can monitor how the school is performing against our aims. We also monitor more specific areas including child safeguarding, teaching and learning attainment, SEN delivery, GDPR, IT infrastructure, grounds and maintenance, risk auditing and more. Our meetings are usually attended by the headteacher or deputy headteacher and often by other members of the team here at Loughton, so we can get feedback on all of the above and more.

The last two years have been incredibly difficult for many of our families and staff. Throughout this time there has been a common consensus of appreciation among the governing board as we watched the Loughton School family step up rather than shy away from these exceptional circumstances. The governing board wishes to thank the parents and the children for all their positivity and resilience during these unprecedented challenges.

Now that restrictions have eased, the trustees have already made several visits to the school and we are looking forward to spending more time in school, attending the many fantastic school events, and getting to know our parents and children.
